

These peek-a-boo Easter cards are a great way to use up scraps of paper and card.

Hatching Egg Card
STORE CUPBOARD

- A4 sheet of yellow card
- A5 sheet of pink paper
- Piece of double-sided stripy, scrapbooking paper
- Pair of googly eyes – 1cm diameter
- Scraps of yellow & red paper
- Scissors & pencil
- Black pen
- Tracing paper

1 Fold the A4 piece of yellow card in half and cut a piece of pink paper approx. 12.5cm x 18.5cm to fit on the front to form a border. Glue the pink paper in position.

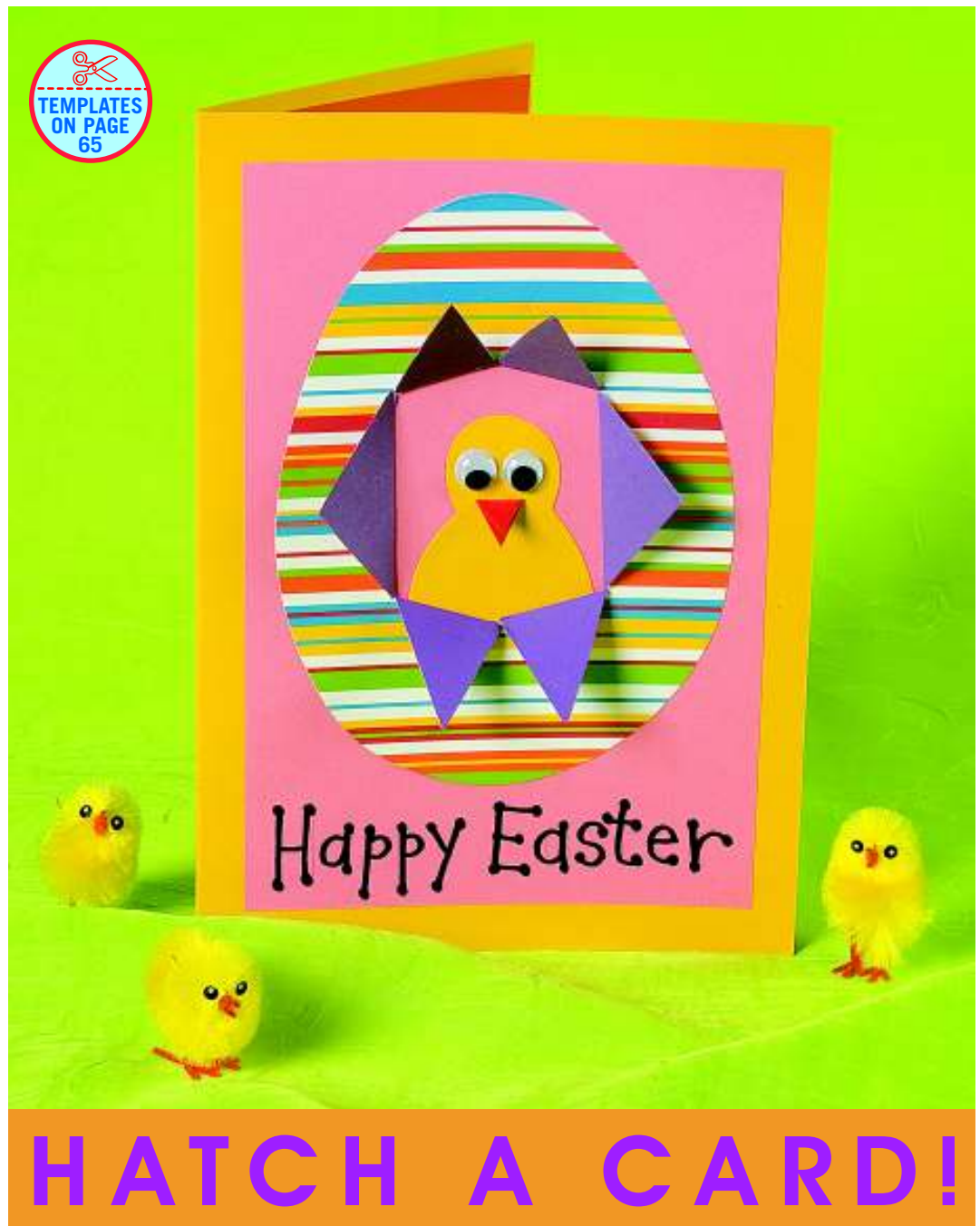
2 Using the egg template, trace onto the scrapbooking paper and cut out. Cut along the score lines indicated and fold the paper outwards to reveal the back of the scrapbooking paper. This gives the hatching effect!

3 Glue the egg shape onto the front of the card, leaving enough room to write a greeting at the bottom.

4 Cut out the chick and beak and glue into place adding the googly eyes. Write an Easter greeting at the bottom in black pen.

DID YOU KNOW?

- We celebrate Easter with the help of eggs because most cultures think of the egg as an emblem of life.
- The first chocolate Easter eggs were introduced around the early 1800s in Germany and France and this tradition soon spread throughout the world.



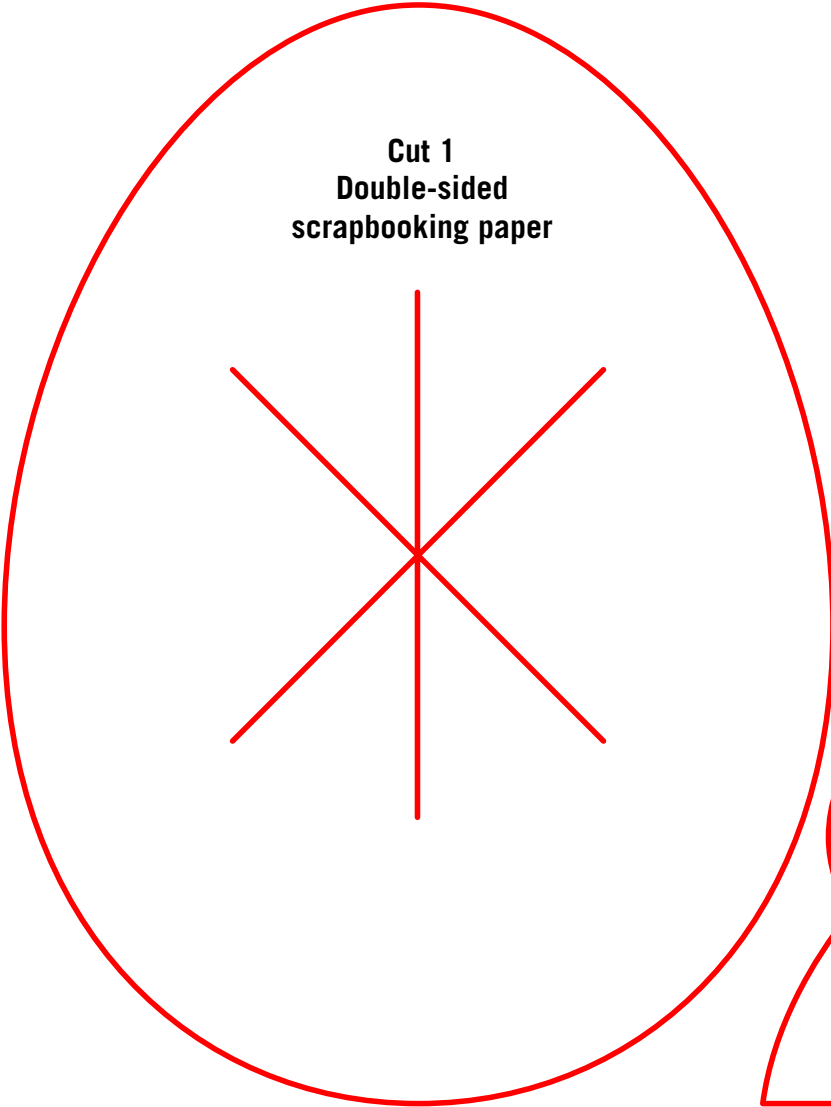
HATCH A CARD!



ALTERNATIVE

The bunny card is made by taking an A4 piece of card and folding the left and right edges into the middle. Using scraps of paper, cut out a bunny shape and stick onto the A5 panel inside the card. Cut an egg shape as before from decorative paper, and cut in half vertically. Stick the two halves on the two flaps and write an Easter greeting on the front.

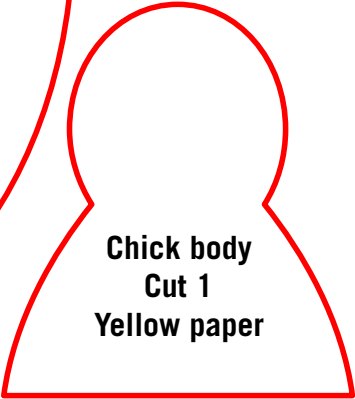
